Dear All,

Welcome to the **first issue** of our Weekly Newsletter! I hope this will help us all. It is important to maintain our close links with each other during the current emergency. I hope it will be especially useful to all those who live alone and/or those who are ill.

Services and Spiritual Matters:

In line with the policy of the Church of England issued *a few days ago* sadly, very sadly, there will **not be any public services in Church** for the foreseeable future.

Secondly though, also in line with the policy of the Church of England, the Church **needs to be open and available to people** for private prayer, particularly during this difficult and distressing period, so that our spiritual lives can be healthily maintained and enhanced.

We have a complication at St Peter's, because of the works which are being undertaken on an intermittent basis. In the light of this new policy however, I have already made arrangements for the Lady Chapel to be made far more secure, so that children cannot get in and hurt themselves climbing the scaffolding etc, (thank you Ollie for carrying out this work!). This will be completed by Sunday. This has cost a bit, but in the light of the present emergency it will be helping everyone. If active work is at any time being undertaken, obviously the church, at particular times, might need to be closed.

From Sunday 22 Mar, the Parish Church of St Peter, will again be **OPEN** *EVERY DAY* **FROM 1000-1600** for private prayer, meditation and reflection: many will undoubtedly want to light a candle for a multitude of different reasons, but especially for loved ones in Jersey and beyond our shores, both living and departed. The Statue of Our Lady and sand-tray for **candles** is near the Sanctuary of the Church.

During Lent the **Stations of the Cross** are in sequence around the walls of the Church reminding us of God's identification, through Jesus, with the suffering of the world: He is with us in all things and circumstances. These can be looked at as a spiritual focus for silent prayers, thoughts, meditations, reflections and devotions: feel free to walk around and look at them or sit as you wish. I think you will feel the very presence of God as you do this, as I did this week in using them.

Another way to nourish your spiritual life is to buy, take home and use this year's Church of England **Lent Booklets:** they really are excellent.

If you come to church at any time, **please straight away use the hand gel or the wipes provided and if the latter drop them in the nearby bin**.

Also, very importantly, **sit or walk at least two yards** (I refuse to say metres!!!) away from anyone else to prevent the spread of the virus.

Enjoy the SILENT TIME ALONE WITH GOD, and may he bless you,

1500 As always, *every week of the year* on **Radio 3** listen to the glories of **Choral Evensong** from a different Cathedral or Abbey each week which is a repeat from the previous Wednesday 15<u>3</u>0 broadcast. Available for 30 days on BBC Sound.

SUNDAYS: 1900 - LIGHT A CANDLE AND PLACE IT IN A WINDOW VISIBLE FROM YOUR STREET

This simple initiative is from the Archbishop of Canterbury: it will help you and others to know that God, through Jesus, is the light of the world and is always with us. Beware of curtains!! Electric candles are best, if you have them. Please leave them lit for at least an hour, but preferably all evening. Look at the candle: think about what some are already going through and pray for them.

WEDNESDAYS on Radio 3

15<u>30</u> As always, *every week of the year* on **Radio 3**, listen to the glories of **Choral Evensong** from a different Cathedral or Abbey each week, repeated on the following Sunday at 15<u>0</u>0. Available for 30 days on BBC Sound.

TO THE CONGREGATION OF THE PARISH CHURCH OF ST PETER.

At this time of great uncertainty, it is only right that the Church in Jersey follows the advice of the Church of England and also the authorities here on the island with respect to health and wellbeing of all those who attend services in our churches.

This is so in St Peter, however one of the most significant issues which we need to consider during the present situation is that the way the congregation gives to support the church in St Peter will need to change, if only for a temporary period.

As everybody is aware the Jersey Deanery is self-supporting, it receives no financial support from the Diocese in Canterbury and apart from a small contribution toward admin and safeguarding costs, the Deanery does not pay anything to the Diocese, all funds raised in Jersey are used to pay the costs of running the Jersey Deanery.

It must also be remembered that our trust fund which currently contributes over 10% of our share may well be affected by the turmoil in the stock market, added to this many of our annual fund raising events may well be cancelled due to the restrictions caused by the virus.

It is therefore critical that the Anglican Churches in Jersey pay their 'Share'. The current share for a parish church in Jersey with a full-time priest is £72,000. St Peter currently receives support from other Churches due to historical events. Therefore for 2020 St Peter is being asked to pay £36,000, (half the share of others). This is money the congregation are asked to give/raise: it is not for the Parish to give this money, as they so generously do with the maintenance of the building.

For the foreseeable future the congregation will not be able to contribute on a weekly basis via the collection and so I feel I must ask you all how we are going to fulfil our giving. Currently there are three ways:

1 On a weekly / monthly basis send a cheque payable to St Peters Church, for your giving, addressed to The Treasurer c/o The Rectory, La Rue due Presbytere, St Peter, JE3 7ZH...or...

2 Write a letter to your bank asking them to pay a monthly sum direct into the St Peters Church, Nat West Bank, Sort Code 60-12-03 account number 66609739...or...

3 For those who have online access, use the account above to set up a standing order, pay a regular monthly amount, or make periodic lump sum payments.

With the unprecedented position the world finds itself in, I in no way wish to add to the anxiety of any member of the congregation, however I am sure you will appreciate it is far better we plan now, continuing to give robustly, so the Parish Church of St Peter, will come out this, financially secure and more importantly spiritually closer than before.
